

A Program of Choice

The ADR Integrated Arts and Technology Cohort is a program of choice. Students from across the Chilliwack School District are eligible to attend regardless of catchment area.

Transportation: Students attending a school of choice, may be eligible for busing based on availability of seating on an existing bus route. Buses will not be re-routed, and no additional stops will be added.

Registration


Students currently enrolled in grades 5, 6, or 7, in Chilliwack schools are eligible to apply for September 2020. Registrations are received online using E-Reg. Learn more at: <https://sd33.bc.ca/registration>.

- Students in grade 5 at FG Leary will have the opportunity to transition directly to the ADR Cohort.
- All other in-district students may apply online via E-Reg.

- Space is limited. If the number of applications exceeds the number of spaces available, a lottery system for selection will be used.

Students leaving the ADR Integrated Arts and Technology Program of Choice at the end of grade 8 will have priority enrolment for the Integrated Arts and Technology Secondary which will open September 2021.




Integrated Arts & Technology Education K - 12
