Welcome to October Raven Families! September flew by and our students have settled into their new routines and classes. As we walk through the halls and visit each class, it is clear that students are engaging in their learning.

As we say good-bye to September, we can reflect on the many activities that took place. We were able to see our Cops for Cancer riders in person this year and RTCS was able to donate \$500 to this worthy cause. Thank you to all of our students and families for their generous participation in our annual Terry Fox event. Classes learned about the impact Terry Fox has had on cancer awareness. Almost \$1,300 was collected for cancer research, and our students demonstrated outstanding compassion and perseverance during the school-wide outdoor run. It was amazing to see the excitement and energy as all students took part.

Another important, school-wide event took place on September 29th. During Orange Shirt Day, students learned about the devastating, inter-generational impacts of residential schools. Parking Lot

We know that parking is at a premium in the morning and at the end of the day. Please make sure you are not parking in the through lanes, bus lanes, or in no parking areas. Our drop-off area is just outside the library. If that is full, please park in the parking lot to avoid unsafe situations and blocking off traffic. Please use the crosswalk and crossing guard when moving back and forth between the parking lot and the school.

Drop Off

Supervision for students begins at 7:30 a.m. Please do not drop off your students or have them walk to school before supervision begins. We also ask that if you are using the drop-off lane, that you remain in your car. This will keep traffic flowing. If you need to get out of your car, please park in the parking lot.

Pick Up

We are doing our best to maintain social distancing at the end of the day and have worked at staggering our dismissal to reduce congestion. We ask that students and parents do not congregate at the front entrance so students can get to their bus or car without walking through a crowd. Students who are getting picked up by a car are asked to wait on the sidewalk in front of the Library.

End of Day

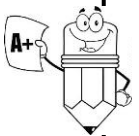

A reminder that parents need to do a quick health check with their child each and every day. If your student is feeling sick, please keep them home until they are feeling better.

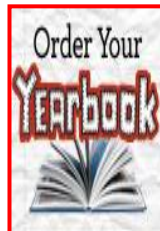
Battery Recycling

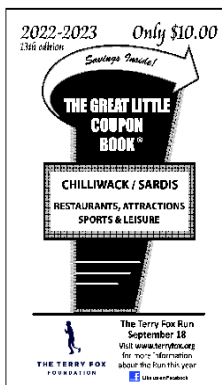

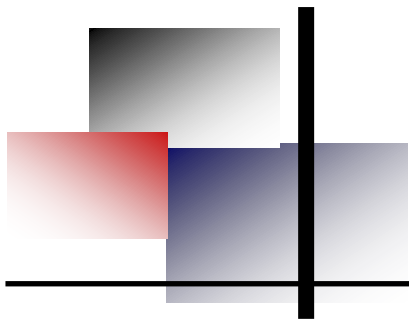

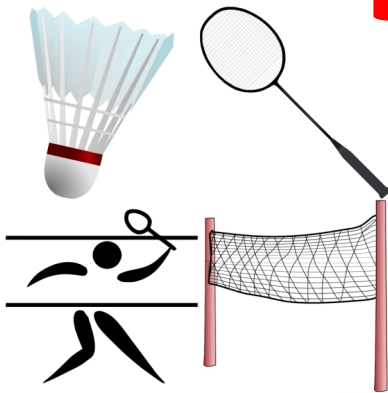
